Dear friends,

This is such a difficult time for everyone. We are self isolating or only going out for real necessities or for daily exercise and many are suffering from job uncertainties or losses, lack of income as well as anxiety and stress whether it be because children are home or wondering what will happen if I become ill.

Love of our neighbour is really coming to the fore and our Cricklade community is full of people who want to help. Here and across our country many are showing the Christian values of compassion and kindness. But it's so sad to hear about or read of people being abusive towards NHS staff or staff in shops or businesses, many of whom are putting their lives on the line to serve the needs of others. "Perfect love casts out fear" – we can only pray for those who are angry because of fear and show them love as we can.

As people of faith, we are shocked to the core that churches are locked but there are ways we can come together, united in Christ; instead of GOING TO church, we are now BEING church. The nature of church is changing to cope with these coronavirus times.

The one thing we CAN ALL do is pray; you may have read how NHS staff are praying before they go on shift. There is immense power in praying and it helps us to trust God with our lives. *Revd Shirley*

So how can we connect with each other and come together?

Listen to or watch a service. C of E have a radio broadcast Sunday and daily service, Songs of Praise is on TV (the broadcast time does vary). If you have the internet, many churches are live streaming worships eg Malmesbury, Archbishop of York.

Sundays at 10 am in Upper Thames will still have Holy Communion at home which (we hope) will be videoed and put up on our Upper Thames Group youtube channel

Morning Prayers – are said by one person on behalf of community in Ashton Keynes 9am, Cricklade 9 am and Latton. Please do join in with the words at home and "in prayer and supplication (we can all) make our requests known to God".

Put a sign of hope in your window - many children and families are displaying a rainbow (a sign of God's covenant with Noah from earliest Biblical times) and on Sunday let's put a lighted candle in our windows as many did last Sunday.

Look for the wow moments and blessings

Many people are saying they have the time and the opportunity to notice what is all around us. And the pollution levels have dropped. Maybe God is telling us to "be in the present" and to notice what is happening in creation, be it the beauty or our lack of care for it.

What is happening in our parishes? Phone networking

In AK and Cricklade we are aiming to set up a phone network so that someone from the church can ring each week just to chat, as well as to see if you could do with any help and to ask if you have a prayer request.

<u>Mothering Sunday posies</u> (before the lockdown) were made by half a dozen ladies in AK and taken round to many who live on their own, are elderly, had been unwell or had tough times.

Many are joining in with the <u>community help</u> scheme in Cricklade and the Link line in AK. God's kingdom is happening all around us.

Thursday: Jesus said, 'I have said this to you, so that in me you may have peace. In the world you face persecution. But take courage; I have conquered the world!' *John 16.33*

Friday: God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. *1 Thessalonians* 5.9,10

Saturday: Jesus said, 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.' *John 8.12*
