The best way to show you the impact of your support is through the words of the self-help group members...

"We never imagined we would have something this beautiful. As uneducated women from a disadvantaged community, we did not think this could happen for us, but thanks to Zimele Wethu, E3 and you, we now have a strong, beautiful building that helps us better ourselves. Even people in our community are amazed by what we have accomplished, especially since some used to look down on us, asking what could possibly be done with just R5 (23p), which was the contribution we all gave at the start."

"Zimele Wethu has given training to develop our skills in agriculture, business and running social projects. This has made a difference in our households and for our children and their learning." Learning in a lovely centre rather than sat on the floor under the trees creates dignity and blesses the ladies.

"This building will serve many purposes as well as earning us income by hosting birthday celebrations and other events."



The power of self-help groups

Zimele Wethu self-help groups:

- build community, give women courage and a voice
- equip them to set up small businesses and farm
- enable them to dream of social projects like building the children's centre and see that become a reality.

"In the past, we used to gather under the trees for our weekly savings meetings, sitting in the sun and getting burned, but things are different now because we finally have a shelter."

"Before joining the self-help group, I struggled alone. Now, I feel supported and confident to grow my farming business."

"Being part of a self-help group taught me that my voice matters, and together we can build a stronger future for our families."

"Through my self-help group, I have learned to save and invest and now have courage to share ideas and see real change in my community."

"My eyes have been opened to how we can achieve more than I ever thought possible by working together."

Group members are enjoying using the centre to provide:

- meals before and after school so children can concentrate
- help with homework so children can succeed at school
- Life Skills workshops so children make good choices in life
- self-help group meetings to save together and plan activities
- a preschool is also planned to enable young children to thrive.

"This building gives our children a quiet space to study, so they can improve themselves and have better opportunities than we had. We didn't get the chance to learn and grow like they can."

Tickets £5.00 per person.

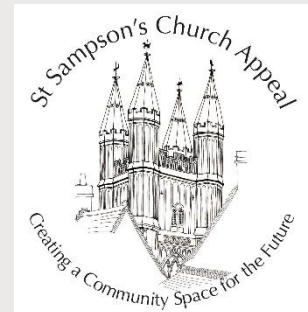
